From the Pastor's pen...

As Easter approaches, our thoughts tend to turn toward the celebration of the miracle of the resurrection. Adults may think about what to cook and who to invite for Easter dinner. Depending on their age, children may participate in Easter egg hunts or learn about Jesus through a series of plastic eggs called Resurrection Eggs. Inside each of those plastic eggs is a symbol that represents a part of the lesson about Jesus' death and resurrection.

While we tend to focus on the resurrection, we must remember there cannot be Easter without Good Friday – no resurrection without a death. We do not like to think about death, do we? It reminds us of people who have gone before us – even some who went much too soon. Death brings us sadness.

But, the death of Jesus is different for us. We should have a sense of sadness and sorrow as we remember and meditate on the betrayal, arrest, beating, crucifixion, and death of our precious Jesus. But...

"...He hung up on that Cross
Then He rose up from that grave..."

Yes, He did! And, that is why we sing praises to God with words like these:

"There's joy in the house of the Lord There's joy in the house of the Lord today And we won't be quiet We shout out Your praise..."

These are just some of the lyrics in a song we sing at Park Ridge called "House of the Lord" by Phil Wickham.

Let's come together on Good Friday at 7:00 p.m. to remember the sacrificial life and death of Jesus so that we can also come together on Easter Sunday to share a continental breakfast at 9:00 and sing our praises to God at 9:30!

Remember...we won't be quiet! We will shout out our praise to Him for all He has done, all He is doing, and all He will do in the future.



Here are some highlights about the work being done by ministries with a personal Park Ridge connection:

Dorr Update –Tim, Kellie, and the girls are still in Texas training, studying Spanish, and preparing to head to Mexico. One of the things driving them is the reality that there are approximately 1.5 billion people who do not have the full Bible in their first language.

Tim shares that, "Of course, there has been progress made over the years with more than 700 languages having a full Bible and at least 1,600 languages having a New Testament. It is also encouraging to know that 1,200 languages do have some translated Bible portions even if they do not have a complete New Testament yet. Work is being done in more than 2,800 languages worldwide in 126 countries. Many of these projects are being worked on by Wycliffe Bible Translators or one of their partner organizations."

Here are a few highlights from the *Free Methodist World Missions Hotline*:

Africa – Superintendent Goodson Phiri of Malawi is seeking our prayers. The southern part of Malawi has been heavily affected by rain because of cyclone Freddy. Road systems are blocked, homes have been destroyed and several have died. The Great Commission Bible School was in session, but four students from the south were released to go home because their families were displaced. Pray those directly impacted will experience God's provision and be encouraged as they trust God.

Asia – Missionary Seth Van Tifflin is currently hospitalized in Chiang Mai, Thailand. Seth is suffering from a herniated disc and a ureter stone and is in significant pain. Please pray for healing as he receives treatment for both issues.

Pray for missionaries Mark and Bryan as they recently taught a Scriptural Survey module this week for pastors from Creative Access Asia-VN. Ask God to enrich the students' hearts and help them learn effective ways to pass this teaching on to those they serve.

Europe –

Pray for opportunities to offer the love and hope of Jesus Christ.

Pray for "M" and "A," a mother and child he assisted over the past year. Ask God to help them find hope and healing.
