From the pastor's pen...

Therefore, since we have been justified through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, ² through whom we have gained access by faith into this grace in which we now stand. And we boast in the hope of the glory of God. ³ Not only so, but we also glory in our sufferings, because we know that suffering produces perseverance; ⁴ perseverance, character; and character, hope. Romans 5:1-4

Happy New Year, everyone! Although if I'm being honest, for me it hasn't been all that happy so far! Most of you are aware that my hip replacement surgery was postponed because I, and most of my family, got COVID after Christmas, then I got a stomach bug, and just as I was beginning to feel better, I threw out my back.

Now in the scope of all the suffering in the world I realize this is small potatoes, but that doesn't mean I haven't spent the good part of a month feeling miserable. We Christians have a weird relationship to suffering, I think. Often, we tend to diminish it, pretend it's not as bad as it actually is: in an effort to please God? It's as if we are real about our suffering, God will think we are not the grateful people we are supposed to be. I wonder who we think we're kidding?

Another common approach to suffering can be to fall into the "poor me!" mentality. We behave as if we are victims just waiting for the next bad thing to happen to us. We moan and complain about every little thing that goes wrong, sometimes amplifying its severity so we get people's pity and help. I don't think this attitude is what the Apostle Paul was talking about when he says, "we glory in our sufferings!"

Paul begins this writing about suffering reminding us of our relationship to God through Jesus Christ. An Old Testament prophecy about Jesus called him "a man of suffering, and familiar with pain." (Isaiah 53:3) The whole point of our lives here on earth is for us to become more and more like Jesus so that others around us can see who our God is, what he is like. I believe this means we are to expect suffering, not in a fearful way, rather in a way that leads to hope. It is through our suffering we become more and more like our Jesus, who put away the glory of heaven and took on all the frailty and pain of being human. If we let it, suffering has a way of revealing to us all those false masks we rely on to make us more acceptable to ourselves and others. It strips us down to our true selves, and it is exactly here that we find God loving us, accepting us, healing us.

As a people, I would say that you at Park Ridge are also going through a season of suffering. You are waiting for your next shepherd, a pastor who can lead you to increasingly reflect Jesus to the people here in Rochester. I want you to know that I see you as suffering well. You are not complaining, you continue ministering, you are hopeful. Well done! I think this can also be for you a season of prayer asking God to reveal what needs to change for you to better reflect Jesus in the coming years. Lay everything on the altar. Make this a priority as you meet in your small groups, in your conversations with each other. Suffering is a time we can become more truly who God intends us to be. Let's step toward that future together. Here are some highlights about the work being done by ministries with a personal Park Ridge connection:

Dorrs Update – Tim, Kellie, Lydia, and Esther are finally permanently in Mexico! Here's a section from their December 2023 newsletter: "Many people have asked us how our first few months in Mexico have been. I think we would have to describe them with one word: BUSY! We have had so much to learn. While many aspects of life are similar to life in the US, there is enough difference in the way things are done here. Every day is a new adventure for us, whether it be driving into the nearby city of Oaxaca (I am pretty sure we take a new road every time we are in the city) to discovering that everything takes longer to accomplish. Even cooking eggs takes longer due to living 5,500 feet above sea level. Not only are normal life activities more work here in Mexico, it is also ALL IN SPANISH! Our family is doing well though. We have learned to adapt and overcome the many challenges that life in Mexico presents every day. We have been able to get our 1-year temporary resident visas. I (Tim) have my driver's license; we have a Mexican bank account; and most recently – we bought a car! All of these things have been challenging, but certainly not impossible. Our language abilities are certainly not where we need them to be yet, but we are advancing every day. We could not have accomplished any of this without the grace of God resting on us. We have seen his hand on our lives over and over again. It is quite amazing to be able to rely on such an amazing and loving God. He is the God of the details! We are certainly thankful for that. Learning to live in another country requires so much figuring stuff out, we often miss the details as we just try to hang on to the bigger picture."

Dublin – Please remember Declan Keenan/Just Ask and Billy Swann/Dublin Family Outreach in your prayers. Far right groups have used that event to enflame anti-immigration sentiments, and a sense of unrest can still be felt in and around the City Centre. Be in prayer for these ministries, and especially for the work of Just Ask as they work with children directly affected by these events. Kirk and Michelle Kettinger will be taking a team of Roberts students back to Dublin to work with Deco and Billy in May 2024. Please pray for that team as they prepare and fundraise for that important work. This will be the first Roberts team to go back to Dublin since the pandemic. • Africa – Free Methodist churches in Cameroon began 20 days of prayer and fasting on January 8. Praise the Lord for 87 new believers in Ethiopia who were baptized during the church's Christmas celebration on January 7. Pray for the growth of these new believers.

• Asia – Thank you for praying for the annual meeting in Thailand. Superintendent Joshua reports that 279 people became believers ers through Christmas outreach, making 589 new believers in 2023!
