From the pastor's pen...

Dear friends,

I am about a month out from my hip replacement surgery, and although I'm keeping busy, enjoying times with all of you in worship, times of play with my granddaughters, times with friends and with Ed, the awareness of that surgery is always there, sometimes just outside of conscious thought. It has given me a new appreciation of how Jesus must have felt the last few weeks of his life.

How do you continue to maintain your ministry, your times of teaching, the times when you are sitting around a campfire eating and laughing with your friends when the day of your death looms ahead coming closer and closer? He may have not even known the exact date but surely he was aware each day, each moment he was closer to the time God had ordained for him to die.

In Matthew, we find him continuing his teaching using parables to bring the realities of kingdom living more alive for his followers. In the Gospel of Mark, we find him repeatedly telling his disciples he's going to die, even as he continues ministering and serving the needs of the people around him. In Luke, we again find him telling his disciples he is going to die, continuing to minister to others, then weeping over Jerusalem as he enters Jerusalem riding on a colt. In John, we find Jesus raising his friend Lazarus from death, predicting his own death, humbling himself to wash his friends' feet, then a final sermon about the absolute necessity for his followers to love one another and to maintain unity together.

Through all these things the drumbeat of death pounded louder and louder in Jesus' mind. He was human, just like us. He didn't want to die, he wanted to live. Yet faithfully, faithfully he walked towards that cross. And as he walked toward that cross with single- minded focus he spent his life, loving, teaching, serving others.

Not to be morbid, but isn't that actually the truth of all of our lives as well? We are all walking towards death. Unless Jesus comes, all of us will die. (We don't really like thinking about that very much!) But, this picture of Jesus' life outwardly focused on loving others, serving them, helping them can also be a map for us of what our lives can be. Should be.

We can get distracted. We tend to get focused on our own needs, wants, dreams... and our culture applauds us for that. But as I look at Jesus' last few weeks of life, I wonder if I've made it way more complicated than it actually is?

In these remaining weeks of Lent, let's together as God's people examine ourselves, let's repent of those places we have failed to love and serve others as Jesus has exemplified for us. Hebrews 12:1-4 says, "Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, ² fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith. For the joy set before him he endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. ³ Consider him who endured such opposition from sinners, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart. ⁴ In your struggle against sin, you have not yet resisted to the point of shedding your blood."

Just like with Jesus, death is not the end of our story. We have a resurrection coming, and the only thing that will follow us into that future life is the love we have for God and for others. So, with that joy set before us, let us untangle ourselves from any way of thinking and living that would keep us from living the life Jesus has set before us. Let us walk towards our death and our life to come with single-minded focus following Jesus' example of love for God and selfless service and care for others.
