There have been a couple of great opportunities for us to get involved in prayer through the month of September. The first is Seeking Together a daily devotional and prayer prompt put on by the Free Methodist Church US.

Lance gets an email each day linking him to the day's devotional and I have just gone onto youtube and watched it there. Lance and I have had some good conversations around these devotionals. Last week, Sept.  $15^{\text{th}}$ , was especially encouraging as it has focused on the gen z genera-

tion. The Lord has laid it on Lance's heart to begin a ministry for this generation and the devotionals/ prayers have been very affirming to us regarding this ministry. I, myself, was really encouraged by the one given by our Bishop, Katie Kolbe. She was encouraging the older generations to be flexible and to consider becoming mentors as many gen z-ers have very little religious or church experience and often biblically illiterate and hungering for connection with the older generations. This is where my passion lies and I have been praying that God would lead me to one or two that I can begin such a relationship with. I encourage you, as you read this, to pause and ask the Lord if He may be directing you in this area as well.

The second opportunity that happened this month was the Make Us One Conference held September 13-14 at the Double Tree in Henrietta. Pam Rende and myself represented Park Ridge at this event and it is our third year attending. It was not a disappointment. The worship and corporate prayer for our Rochester community and churches is powerful to see people from all different churches praying together for each other and for revival. It really makes the Big C (church) feel real. Friday evening after corporate praver Rabbi Jim Appel spoke. Rabbi Jim is the rabbi at Shemi Yisrael the messianic Jewish temple in Brighton, New York. Pam and I sat in front of Rabbi Jim and some of his family, so when we broke into small groups to pray for each other's individual needs we joined with them. As we introduced ourselves and shared the name of our home church their faces lit up because after 7 years in the making they were able to get a building of their own through the hard work of a fellow Free Methodist congregation. They are currently in Edgewood Free Methodist's former location in Brighton. He spoke on repentance over the division that was caused between Jewish and gentile believers back in the 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> century. Pam and I were shocked because we had been totally unaware of what had happened and why messianic Jews and gentile believers do not often worship together as they have so much to offer us in learning about their rich heritage and how it brings deeper understanding to customs and celebrations talked about throughout scripture. He has written 13 books and several of them are about understanding the Jewish holidays and their significance in our individual lives and the world, as a whole. I would love to invite Rabbi Jim to Park Ridge to share what he shared at Make Us One and to teach us about Jewish tradition and celebrations. That was only a small portion of this year's conference that is working to bring the body of Christ together in the Greater Rochester area. I had the opportunity to speak with one of the founders of the conference and understand why more churches are not aware of it and I'm praying about getting more involved in solving that problem. They are wonderful people with a vision and passion for our community.
